An inexpensive wine with expensive structure and deep color. Intense black fruit scents are accompanied by hints of wood spice, cinnamon, rose and a suggestion of white pepper. Blackberry, black cherry and currant are delivered on a big palate with balanced acidity and firm tannins.
